Safe bet – stay in bed on March 15th and hope March goes out like a lamb

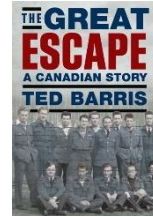

Please be aware that many people are very allergic to scents so please DO NOT wear perfume or aftershave to gatherings.



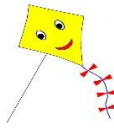
WESTBEN AND WOODLAWN INN “Crazy for Gershwin”

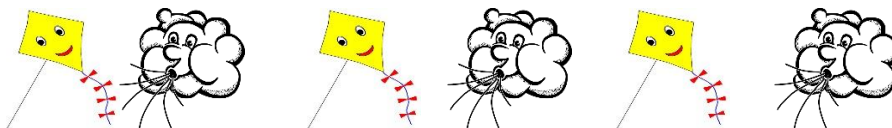
WALKING on WEDNESDAYS

AJAX LIBRARY

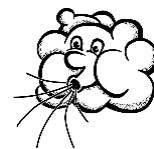
