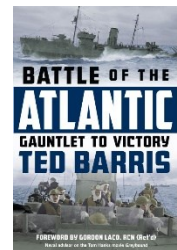
TED BARRIS – Battle of the Atlantic: Gauntlet to Victory

Ted Barris, a noted military historian, once asked his father, Alex, “What did you do in the war?” What the former US Army medic then told his son forms the thrust of Barris’s latest historic journey—an exploration of his father’s wartime experiences as a medic leading up to the Battle of the Bulge in 1944-45, along with stories of other medics in combat throughout history.



Barris’s research reveals that this bloodiest of WWII battles was shouldered largely by military medics. Like his father, Alex, medics in combat evacuated the wounded on foot, scrounged medical supplies where there seemed to be none, and dodged snipers and booby traps on the most frigid and desolate battlefields of Europe. While retracing his father’s wartime experience, the author weaves into his narrative stories about the life-and-death struggles of military medical personnel during a century of service.

In this unique front-line recounting of the experiences of stretcher-bearers, medical corpsmen, nurses, surgeons, orderlies, dentists, and ambulance drivers, Barris explores the evolution of battlefield medicine at such historic engagements as Fredericksburg, Batoche, the Ypres Salient, the Somme, Vimy, Singapore, Dieppe, Normandy, Falaise, Bastogne, Korea, Iraq, and Afghanistan. Barris’s sources reveal—like never before—why men and women sporting the red cross on their helmets or sleeves didn’t flee to safety but chose instead to rush to assist.

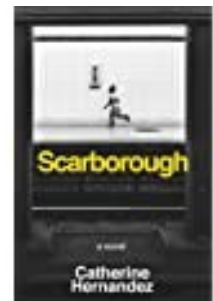

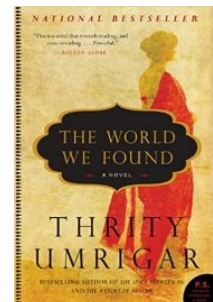


WORDS WORTH READING BOOK CLUB

SHARING OUR RECIPE

This month I am sending you a spectacular recipe that makes **“The Big Guy”** hustle out to the **Capital Letter Store** and come back with a bottle of **Dry Marsala Wine**. It is the key flavour ingredient of this recipe and you cannot substitute any other wine to get that special Marsala flavour. I found this recipe at www.feastingathome.com and I have tested this recipe many times (3 bottles of Marsala worth). I am confident that it will be one of your **“Company is Coming!”** special recipes. I have added the peppercorns as I like to have that burst of peppery goodness in my mouth when you unexpectedly crunch into one. This sauce is not a gravy but more of an “au jus”. For extra richness, add more cream, or for a looser sauce, add more broth or wine.



Chicken Marsala

Adapted for 2 Hungry Seniors
Serve with mashed potatoes and cooked peas, beans, carrots, or asparagus

“The Big Guy” recommends a chilled crisp clear Sauvignon Blanc or a chilled Pinot Grigio.

¼ cup flour
1 tsp salt
½ tsp pepper
2 boneless skinless chicken breasts in 4 cutlets
2 Tbsp olive oil
1 Tbsp butter
2-3 cups of sliced mushrooms – button, cremini, portobello, or shiitake
1 shallot, finely sliced (substitute ½ red onion)
3 cloves garlic, minced
1 Tbsp chopped fresh oregano and/or thyme
1 tsp whole peppercorns, crushed (optional)
1 cup chicken broth
¾ cup dry Marsala wine
½ cup heavy cream or half and half

Table Garnish:
Fresh Parsley
Fresh Thyme

1. Mix the flour, salt, and pepper on a plate or in a zip-lock bag. Cut the chicken into cutlets so each cutlet is about ½ inch thick.
2. Heat oil and butter in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Dredge each cutlet in the flour and immediately sear each side of the cutlet for 3 minutes then remove from the pan and set aside.
3. Lower the heat, add one more Tbsp of olive oil and butter to the pan then add mushrooms, shallot, garlic, oregano, thyme, peppercorns, salt, and ground pepper. Sauté until the mushrooms start to release their liquid and begin to brown slightly.
4. Add the chicken broth, Marsala wine, and heavy cream. Nestle the chicken cutlets into the sauce and simmer for 12-15 minutes until the sauce has reduced by half and the chicken is fully cooked.
